Mr. Schroeder called the meeting to order with Mr. Lammers and Mr. Schlumbohm by reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Tim Schnipke stopped in to give the Commissioners an update on the Sewer pump repairs and maintenance. He also said the Board of Elections employees are complaining of a dirty tree near their parking area they would like it cut down. Tim said in two weeks it won't make any difference there will be more parking available.

Joe Moenter and Kristi Powell of Veteran Services met with Commissioners to discuss the land for the Memorial. Joe talked about some land available for a new memorial near the Putnam County Library. The Memorial at the Fairgrounds will remain. There are three ladies who are pushing the erection of a new memorial. The Veteran Service cannot contribute to a new memorial but they can care for and maintain standing memorials. If a new memorial is erected along Putnam Parkway it should be on the end near St. Rt. 15 to be more visible. The people would have to provide the funding and then the planning can be started. It would be a Putnam County Veteran Memorial not Ottawa only. The Commissioners are in agreement to use the triangular section along Putnam Parkway and St Rt 15. GIS maps of the area were viewed. Veteran Service will contact the Village to see what would be allowed due to right of ways.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers; Cindy Landwehr, Clerk and Martin Verni, Putnam County Sentinel.

Joe Burkhart met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to discuss the IT budget. Joe presented a spreadsheet of the figures for his past expenses and future needs. Joe said he would like to get extended support for the virtual servers (approx. \$50,000). We do have backup servers in place for disaster recovery. The extended support includes training. If a server goes down or gets infected, backup can be run through the other servers at Sheriff's office or vice versus to keep things up and running. All the windows machines are being updated. The Sheriff's office will need computer upgrades since they have not been upgraded for a few years. A website upgrade is needed also. Joe would like a CMS website rather than HDML. The CDC recently updated their page through a company in Perrysburg, there are many options for updates that are being reviewed. We can get the option to continue to host the website also. Joe is looking for more continuity in the website and have the pages to be more compatibility with each other. Joe said the size of his department is good. There is still capacity available on the servers and some things need to be cleaned out. Joe said his office can located anywhere due to being able to work remotely on computers but he would like to remain on the same side of the railroad tracks as the Courthouse and Sheriff office due to some critical issues and time constraints.

The minutes from Tuesday May 14, 2019 were reviewed and approved.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers left to view Sewer Dist #1 and the drainage and a sink hole in that area.

Greg Bockrath of Bockrath & Associates met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to discuss some engineering needed for Sewer Dist #1. Commissioner Schlumbohm said they think Fairview, Eastowne and Sunset probably are the worst with drainage. Ottawa Drive a possibility. Commissioner Schroeder said we will want to check with the village Lammers said let Greg talk to the Village to see what their parameters would be. Greg said he could do that. He said the first option is to put it in the right of way but not in the pavement. Will also need to see how the drainage was originally done. Greg Bockrath said he heard some of the homeowners had contractors come in and hook their down spouts and sump pumps in when they were inputting the sewer system. I & I projects are good with EPA for projects like this. Commissioner Schroeder said it is important to coordinate with Ottawa so that they will take over these sewer districts. Commissioner Schlumbohm said that there is a meeting for the residents on June 12, 2019 at 7pm and they would like Greg to come and bring some preliminary figures. Greg said it is all probably PVC. The original sanitary sewer probably went in late 70s. Aerial map that goes around the properties, Commissioner Schlumbohm said he will get the spec book that the company that does lining work currently has.
