WHEREAS, A question of insurance eligibility was brought up to the Putnam County Commissioners regarding the reduced work hours during the COVID-19 stay at home order.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners had the following rules presented to them regarding temporary health insurance enrollment eligibility.

- 1. Full-time permanent employees regularly scheduled to work 30 hours or more per week are eligible to enroll.
- From May 1 to December 31, 2020, employees who would otherwise meet the above criteria, but are working at least 20 hours due to a Modified Work Week Schedule Program, Mandatory Cost Savings Plan, or similar shall be eligible to enroll or remain enrolled.
- 3. From May 1 to December 31, 2020 and subject to any collective bargaining agreement, employees who would otherwise meet the criteria in #1 above and who are laid off shall not be eligible to continue enrollment as an active employee and will be offered continued benefits as allowed under COBRA.
