Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers held a conference call with Jim Vorst from the Airport Board regarding them purchasing a mower. The Commissioners approved them to purchase a new mower and the Commissioners will advance funds to them to aid in the purchase and the Airport can pay it back when they have funds in their operations funds.

The Commissioners also discussed the truck that was purchased for Solid Waste transportation. The new big truck will not be needed when the recycling moves inside, a new smaller truck may be needed in the future. If the remote collection sites are reactivated a truck may still be needed. The new concrete for recycling is set to be started at the end of May.

The Commissioners made a call to Rush Truck Center for getting a value on the newly purchased truck if it were possibly traded or sold. The truck could also be posted on gov deals for sale. The County still needs a truck for hauling leachate, which the new truck could be used for also if needed. The age and condition of the leachate truck was also discussed. No decision on the trucks is needed immediately.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Cindy Landwehr, Clerk.

The minutes from Tuesday May 16, 2023 were reviewed and approved.

Tim Schnipke met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to discuss the sewer line repairs at the Health Dept. Tim also talked about the Sewer Dist. #1 payment and the estimates that were used by the Village of Ottawa. The meter hours will be reset back to 0 for the beginning of June. Tim is looking into new check valves for the pump stations \$1,740 each the flanges are \$275 each. The valves are working but there are some issues. Tim will continue in working to get the equipment to replace the valves, depending on the price our maintenance staff may replace the valves. Tim confirmed the concrete for Recycling will start the end of May. The Commissioners asked Tim opinion on which truck to get rid of. Tim did not know. The age and condition of the Peterbuilt leachate truck was discussed again. Tim said the Commissioners need to talk to Joe about the recycling tubs and moving them. Tim said the sewer line will be

able to be moved for the vendor camping at the fairgrounds. The current camping hookups electrical and sewer need to be taken out and moved. Is that included in the bids. The waterlines will be moved also. Tim will contact Technicon to verify what is included in the bid. Lighting for the parking area was discussed. Tim said Gary Hermiller is 99% done at the fairgrounds and there is an overage on Gary's quote which is agreeable. The new waterlines will be added to the fairgrounds prints done by Bockrath & Assoc.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers met with Kim Nordhaus to discuss supplemental insurance options for employees. Kim confirmed that the County does not pay any fees for the deductions for the AFLAC premiums. New information from Family Heritage was received and reviewed. Family Heritage can direct bill the employees and avoid the payroll deductions. AFLAC goes along with the employee FSA. So, if AFLAC would be dropped so would the FSA program. Kim explained her process for the employee deductions. If employees are direct billed rather than payroll deduction, will they make the payments on time. The coverage on Family Heritage level 3 matched the coverage from AFLAC. Kim explained that it is not a big inconvenience for doing the payroll deductions. The Commissioners did not think about the FSA and do not want to lose it.
