Ashley Siefker met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers about the Tall Timber Ag Complex Lease. The Commissioners decided to grant their requests to stay at a

variable billing process for the remainder of their current lease. Ashley will evaluate the current lease document and make any necessary updates and have everyone sign.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Alaina Siefker had a zoom meeting with Dawn Coleman and Pat Loper in regards to the ongoing TSS issues at the landfill. Dawn said Pat had her do some additional sampling to see what the results show if it is worth moving the outfall. She sampled at outfall as normal and sampled where a skimmer could possibly be & sampled small pond @ 5 feet out from edge. Unfortunately, in those results, the TSS was higher most of the time. Relocating the pipe won't give us the results we were looking for. Pat said we could put a rock line to stop the wave action with rip rap. Will need a fabric filter and then use a hoe and put the pieces of concrete on top of it, don't dump so it doesn't rip. It could be around \$20/ton. The area that needs done would be about 300 lineal feet and would probably be around \$75-\$80,000 for a contractor to do that. Normally if you have 3 exceedances in a row you could go to non-compliance but we have some months that there is no flow. Commissioners said they want to think on this. They are there to try to find the best things to spend county tax payers' money on and they find spending that kind of money on a pond (and with no 100% guarantee it will work) ridiculous. The water is super clean that comes off the hill and everyone knows that it is from the water hitting the bank and picking up the muddy particles from that. Pat said the study was very little cost so far. The commissioners want to ride it out at this time and see what happens or get a 2nd opinion down the road.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Ashley Siefker, Assistant Clerk.

The minutes from Tuesday, June 13, 2023 were reviewed and approved.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers met with Amy Sealts and Rachelle Conine with the CIC about information on a new program with Tracy Warnecke. Shawn Carvin (Ohio Land Bank Association) and Estee Miller (Maumee Valley Regional Planning) were also in attendance. Possible Land Bank in Putnam County was discussed. Works in conjunction with CICs and Port Authorities. 115 of ORC. Reduced procurement, tax exempt, nuisance violations and other more relaxed restrictions. 66 have been created to do vacant and abandoned properties. Function after foreclosure and can be used as an agent for local government. Focused on the end use of the properties. If they get land from a sheriff sale then local fees can be waved but IRS stays after a first sheriff sale. Habitat can also be involved to get homes up to code while Land Bank makes sure codes are followed. Two Commissioners, Treasurer, rep from largest municipality and township and additional can be added up to four. CIC would be in charge. They will work on the commercial part first. Williams County has some success stories. There is environmental immunity. There are clean up funds available also, with Brownfields as well. Maumee Valley serves five counties for the Site Revitalization. It was thought DRETAC funds were the seed money to start the program. Demolitions can be done and the property can be put into the land bank or the current owners can keep the property. The County can hire Maumee Valley to manage their land bank if they decide to form one. Maumee Valley would administer the grant including the Community Block Development Grants on behalf of the County and would collect the administrative funds from the grant. The process would be uniform for each county. Administrative fees would be 10% of the grant amount. A resolution would be the first step to form a land bank. OLBA has a 14-member board with members from different counties. Tracy contacted Paulding County about this program. Tracy did not hear any bad point of having a land bank. Lima had a large portion of their downtown area within a

landbank that were revitalized. Public nuisance abatement is reason for acquiring land per ORC 1367. Property can be revitalized and put back into service or improved to increase value and return to the tax collection. Amy said there are properties available within the Village of Ottawa that are available to be developed. The Board would be making the decisions and could be used outside the corporations limits out in the townships.

Commissioner Schroeder left to attend the Farm Bureau Luncheon.

The County schools were hesitant to participate in the landbank due to lower tax collection. But if the land is redeveloped a newer bigger structure could be built with higher tax value, so the schools would be getting higher payments on that new value. It was discussed if it would be much benefit to Putnam County since it is a smaller populated county. The Commissioners will discuss and Tracy is on board if a land bank is created. Money could be loaned to create the land bank and once it is established it could be paid back to the county. The County did participate in the demolition grant this past year. Going forward if the land bank is formed Maumee Valley could administer for us. The recording fees would be required to be waived for landbank transactions.
