The visual appearance of the solar farm and that there are low hanging lines that cross the current drives was discussed. The appearance of the solar farm is not entirely what is desired yet. The solar farm is not yet completed so things could still be changing.

Judge Niese met with Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers regarding some courtroom renovations. The Judge is requesting some capital funding for the improvements he is proposing. The railing is attached to the floor, the benches are falling apart and there have been issues with getting larger people up to the witness stand. There are not frequent issues with large amounts of people in the courtroom. Commissioner Lammers asked about moving the courtroom to the first floor. Judge Niese said he does have room to expand but he does not think that is needed at this time. The clerk staff is shared for both Common Pleas and Municipal courts so there would be wiring issues between the two courts. Judge said Ryan could be moved up near the courts. Probation and Parole would be best to keep them on the first floor. The Assembly Room is larger but there would be issues with the Clerk staff. If the benches are ever redone in the Assembly Room the benches from the courtroom could be repurposed in the Assembly Room. The Commissioners are ok with the improvements needed and would like to see a sketch of the proposed improvements. Once they see what is going to be done, they can approve a budget. The Judge is proposing rearranging the room moving the bench and the

creating more seating space, and creating a center aisle for mobility for those in motorized scooters or wheelchairs. The Commissioners can go up and view the courtroom.

Students for Life members of the Kalida Chapter met with Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers for a presentation of a proclamation from the Commissioners. Ella Schumacher, Grace Rall, Lauren Bockrath, Kaylynn Bockrath, Mariah Kerner, Anna Schumacher, Evelyn Cattell, Maddie Houck, Gracyn Schweiterman, Group Advisor and Jill Zeller Director of Religious Education for St. Michael's. Tim Schnipke and Aaron Vorst met with Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers to review the drainage plans for the grandstand and the new building. Kevin Niese of Technicon will come in on Thursday morning to review the plans. Tim explained some issues that have been discovered with the construction and digging at the fairgrounds.
