Nolan Croy came in to talk to Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers regarding the solar regulations. The townships have been throwing the responsibility on the Commissioners, when the townships can set their own regulations. The Prosecutor informed the Commissioners of the process for them to restrict solar facilities under 50 megawatt. It is apparent that the townships should do this since it is more local and much simpler process. The Commissioners wanted to inform the townships of their powers and responsibility. If the AEZ is revoked the generation companies would pay sales tax and property tax. The Commissioners will look at limiting the over 50 megawatt projects and revoking the AEZ. Due to HB 501 the Commissioners can approve or disprove the projects. They want to protect the farmers' rights for their land and also protect the neighbors' rights. The Planning Commission will revise their rules as well.

Tim Schnipke stopped in to talk to the Commissioners regarding the estimates for the storm damages and maintenance issues. Tim has estimate for upgraded electrical for the grandstand. The trenching for the sewer line at the fairgrounds was discussed. The grindings from the old buildings can be used to fill in the trench to save the cost of purchasing more stone. The storm drainage is for the street for the village. Tim would like to talk to the Village to see the location of the tile and definitely where it drains. He would like to put dye in it to find out. Tim will talk to Alan with the village to see if they would be interested in cameraing the line. New signs are up for recycling. Ohio Logistics will be filling up the rental space again. Tim is working on moving the old jail cell also. The unused recycling bins need to be stored somewhere. If they are empty they could possibly be stored at the landfill. There are three full metal bins sitting in the docks that need to be sorted and baled.

Charlie Wannemacher stopped in to talk to the Commissioners about the Jeanette Meyer ditch project. Mr. Wannemacher wanted to let the Commissioners know his lawn did not get finished. The contractor Sand Ridge Excavating will be contacted to get it finished since the lawn had had plenty of time to settle.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers and Cindy Landwehr, Clerk.
