Nolan Croy came in to give Commissioners Schroeder and Schlumbohm an update on solar farms. Patrick Blasius joined the meeting also. Nolan shared some information from a third party regarding a solar farm who is willing to abide by the current regulations in place. This location would in Pleasant and Riley township. It would be 54 acres of usable space. Pleasant has their own solar regulations recently passed, which is nothing larger than ½ mega-watt. Riley township is not currently zoned. Brad Brubaker joined the meeting also. The township and planning commission rules must be followed. The solar company wanted to verify the regulations in place. The townships are lowering it to \(\frac{1}{2} \) megawatt which would generally be personal use, about 3 acres. The townships have used the township association language to base their rules, which is not specific. Perry and Jennings are not doing any additional restrictions. Riley, Sugar Creek and Blanchard are not zoned. Riley is looking into getting zoned. A representative from the Township Trustee Assoc. will be at the Trustee Banquet in April. Deed restrictions were brought up, a restriction could be added for no future solar panels on the property. Other deed restrictions were brought up also. Current sale rates were discussed for farm ground along with the type of soils. There were many inquiries in March from solar companies, but the inquiries come in spurts. The Continental solar farm was done before any regulations were put in place. The solar companies like this area because there is access to the electric grid. The personal

use panels have penalties if more energy is produced than what is used. Water power was brought up with water powered sump pumps.

Commissioners Schroeder and Schlumbohm attended the Elected Officials Meeting in the courthouse break room.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder and Schlumbohm and Cindy Landwehr, Clerk. Brad Brubaker joined the meeting.

The minutes from Thursday, March 28, 2024 were reviewed and approved.

Tim Schnipke with Maintenance came in to discuss with Commissioners Schroeder and Schlumbohm updates on the Event Center Progress, Airport Maintenance & Safety City Setup. Tim said the work on the building is not progressing at the rate that was proposed on the schedule at the last meeting. The Commissioners will need to press the issue to keep it on track to get completed on time. There are still leaks in the building with the rain we are getting. At southwest entrance the hole for the lighting was cut bad and ruined two sheets of siding. Tim brought up the set for Safety City in May at the Ag Complex, Cathy Schroeder is pushing to get the plans finalized for the set up. The rooms originally promised are now rented out and full. Carl Brown, of Ohio Logistics offered use of his warehouse space behind the old Philips building, that would be available at the time needed. If the Commissioners are ok with the change Tim will present it to Cathy for holding the Safety City Program. The old forklift is getting serviced this week. The airport hangars were brought up, the county owns the buildings at the airport. Tim is asking who is supposed to do the maintenance in the hangars. The airport manager does not do building maintenance. So is the county responsible for building maintenance. Tim is asking who is supposed to fix and maintain the fire suppression system and the exit. There is a panel that should be looked at regularly. The trees need trimmed and who is responsible to do that. These items will be brought up at the next airport board meeting. Tim showed at picture of the drain near the SD #1 pump station. There is a wash out and the drain needs a riser put on it. Bockrath & Assoc. have been contacted about leveling in sewer district #1.
