Brian Jostpile and Mike Lenhart met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to discuss the St Rt 12 And Road 17-S stop sign. Mr. Jostpile is voicing his concerns on the installation of the stop sign. There are many people who want the stop sign removed. Mr. Jostpile does not live in Putnam County but he does own ground in Putnam County. That is the only intersection that has a stop sign for a county road on Lincoln Highway from Findlay to Delphos. This stop sign is a hinderance to large trucks trying to turn. Mr. Jostpile does not think the stop sign is needed. Mr. Mull who owns the property one the corner and who happens to be a Sugarcreek township trustee. The trustees said this was not presented from the trustees. It was presented from Mr. Mull privately. Mr. Lenhart has the accident records for that intersection. The stop sign has been there since last fall. According to ORC there must be five accidents within a 12-month period to initiate a stop sign. There were 7 accidents within 11 years. Mr. Jostpile feels there was misrepresentation to get the stop sign installed. The Engineer has been widening other intersections all over the county. A traffic study was done prior to the stop sign being installed, Jan 8, 2019, which showed about 500 cars on 17-S and about 600 cars on Old SR 12. Reflective signs and stop ahead signs were installed. Mr. Lenhart reviewed the reports and maps and the accident numbers have dropped. Most of the accidents are operator error. Mr. Mull's initial visit was most likely as a concerned citizen. Mr. Lenhart reviewed the rules of how these situations should be handled. According to ORC there are things that should be done and thins that can be done depending on the wording of the code. This decision was based on public safety and keeping people safe. This particular intersection was one of the worst in the county for accidents. Mr. Jostpile asked if ODOT was involved with this decision. The decision was not based on traffic. Mr. Jostpile asked why the signage was not increased on Road 17-S for the stop signs. Mr. Lenhart said they are trying to stop fatalities. The decision was made based on public safety to be proactive not reactive. The Commissioners made their decision based on the advice of the Engineer. Mr. Jostpile does not think the stop sign installation was done correctly. Mr. Jostpile would like the stop sign removed on Old SR 12. The Commissioners explained their decision was based on public safety not as an inconvenience to drivers. This intersection was a problem spot in the county for many years. Mr. Lenhart said they wanted to make a decision before a fatality happens. ODOT will be consulted on this matter also. This was the same scenario as Old 224 and Road 5, which has remedied by adding a four way stop.
