The watershed is interested in using the County's driveway for maintenance access to the river. Access to the river is needed to provide the flood relief. A letter of intent was given to the Commissioners showing interest in utilizing the County's access. The letter will be reviewed by the County Prosecutor. Most of the vehicles using the drive would be pickups, small tractors, or mowers. There are still negotiations with AEP to use their access as well for any construction. It was thought that any assistance with flood mitigation would be openly received. If the access from AEP is granted then the access through the County property is not needed. An electronic copy of the letter was requested to make any changes easier.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers; Cindy Landwehr, Clerk and Martin Verni, Putnam County Sentinel.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers held a joint phone conference with Allen County Commissioners regarding Warrington/Sugar Creek to set date time and place for final hearing. Nathan David and Joe Gehring of the Allen Co Engineer were also in attendance on the phone conference. The hearing will be set as Feb 28, 2019 at Bath Township House at 1:30 p.m.

A new request for the additional alleyway to be vacated will need to be done. Since there was no opposition to the street and alley way vacations the Commissioners passed a resolution granting the vacation request made by the Sugar Creek Township trustees.
