Section 1: The President of the Putnam County Commissioners is hereby authorized to apply to the Ohio Development Services Agency for CDBG Residential Public Infrastructure Grant (RPIG) financing necessary to finance a portion of both projects.

Section 2: The Rural Community Assistance Partnership (RCAP) is hereby authorized to submit the electronic applications to the Ohio Development Services Agency for CDBG Residential Public Infrastructure Grant (RPIG) financing.

Section 3: This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon final passage as an emergency measure.

Mr. Schroeder called the meeting to order with Mr. Lammers and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Steve Coburn-Griffis from the Sentinel stopped in to talk to the commissioners about the increase in COVID-19 cases and how we are now orange in the state. Commr Schroeder said the increase has been expected and we need some of those to get some immunity. Commr Lammers said the number of deaths have decreased as a percentage. Do you plan to move forward with something along the lines with what you initially presented to the Health Commissioner? Commr Lammers said he is hoping to get more information from the meeting coming up and at this time we probably will not move forward with the items initially presented.

Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers met with Joe Hohlbein and Alaina Siefker to discuss recycling. Joe said we will need to hire someone to help out there since college kids will be leaving and put ad in paper for recycling technician to work variable hours. Commr Schroeder said we could also look at moving drop off inside. Joe said could put a door in that automatically opens like 8-10 feet like Tractor Supply has, doesn't have to be high. Commr Lammers said right now this year they don't want to spend any more money. Commr Schroeder thinks we should look into doing this before winter. Alaina said a gentleman came in from Ottoville about the recycling. I explained that we need the help with our village recycling. He said he would make sure they would have plenty of help. At this time the commissioners want to hold off on the villages.

Deputy Thornton gave the commissioners a paper that he printed off that says Ohio doesn't have a requirement as of July 13, 2020 to check visitors temperatures and that it is just required to have employees conduct daily health self-assessments and must not report to work if symptomatic. Thornton wanted to know if the Commissioners still want visitors checked or not. Commr. Lammers said to continue doing it for now. He is going to the Health Dept. meeting and will ask then and let security know on Thursday.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers along with Ashley Siefker, Asst. Clerk.

Auditor Bob Benroth came in to update the Commissioners on COVID-19 expenses and employee pay, regulations and reimbursements. He will be sending a memo to all offices to start collecting reimbursable items and their costs so it can be consolidated for reporting. Because of State auditing notations, he also is looking at hiring an accounting firm to help keep things in order and are experts when reporting GASBs, leases and such. He wants the Commissioners to sign the contracts if and when the time comes.
