Brian Hilvers stopped in to present the Commissioners with the agreement for representation regarding the request for forming a union within the EMS department. The pros and cons of having a union were reviewed.

Tim Schnipke stopped into update the Commissioners on the fair. Tim said once they got the bugs worked out on Monday things went better. Tim informed the Commissioners that one of Ohio Logistics renters is moving out of the Ag Complex. The location and condition of this area in the building was discussed.

Tim asked about working with the Village and getting the sewer district smoke tested. The air units are all installed within the courthouse there are a few units that still need to be completed. The chiller for the courthouse is in, they were waiting for all the units to be installed prior to replacing. The jail chiller is also in and ready for replacement. The drainage at the Health Dept. is done. The Health dept roof will be replaced in August. The carpet replacement for courthouse offices will be looked at next year. Tim said there is a new AEP regional supervisor who he can work with for electrical service at the fairgrounds. Damschroder is done at the Ag complex with the roof replacement. Tim asked about a new truck.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Cindy Landwehr, Clerk.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers joined a conference call with Henry County Commissioners regarding the collection of joint county ditches for maintenance assessment. For Putnam County-Walther Joint County Ditch and Royal Group Main will be collected. For Henry County -Reese Dt,

The minutes from Thursday June 23, 2022 were reviewed and approved.

Dylan Borchers, Jeff Reinkmeyer and Andrew House of Avangrid met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to give an update on the Powell Creek Solar Farm. The project is being surveyed. Dylan said the siting board has released new proposed rules, 150 ft off of road edge, 300 ft from a non-participating house for panel location. There are some other

rules that are deemed unreasonable. 150 ft off of non-participating property line is a rule that may be challenged. Some property owners have contacted The Commissioners with concerns about the location of the site regarding their property. The panels will be notched out 300 ft & 400ft at the intersection of SR 108 and 613. There were other concerns about standing water. The ditching records for the area were inquired about and the tile maps that were available were submitted. There is a permit allowing the timing for the pile driving work. The Commissioners asked about the impact of inflation on the project. All of the projects have had to have been repriced. It has impacted all the contracts for Avangrid. The anti-circumvention regarding the manufacturing of the solar panels was brought up. The panels are manufactured in Thailand, Vietnam and surrounding countries including China. There is a lawsuit involving tariffs on the manufacturing of the panels outside the US. There have been some fluctuations in the construction dates and farm dates due to the supply chain issues. Since the construction dates were pushed back the owners were allowed to farm the ground another year prior to construction. The panels for this project were brought up. Commissioner Schroeder asked about renegotiating the payments for the County due to the delays and inflation also. Future and other current projects were brought up and rules that could be put in place. There are production and pricing issues both regarding manufacturing the panels. The tariffs may be waived for a few years for solar projects. There are panels upgrades that are being made.

Mr. Lammers moved to go into executive session with Dylan Borchers, Andrew House and Jeff Reinkmeyer and Commissioners Schroeder and Schlumbohm to consider confidential information related to the specific business strategy, of an applicant for additional economic development assistance, and to negotiations with other political subdivisions respecting requests for economic development assistance.
