Mr. Lammers called the meeting to order with Mr. Schroeder and Mr. Schlumbohm.

Tim Schnipke stopped into give Commissioners an update on maintenance issues and the sewer districts. Sewer district 2 project is ready to go, sewer district 1 pump station needs some attention pumps is running but not processing.

Adam Schimmoeller stopped in to talk to the Commissioners about the Recycling program and how it is currently running. It was discussed to have a police officer present to help with the contamination. Some additional help was discussed.

Adam Cupp, Deanna Averesch of UIS Insurance, Jonathan Fortman, Laurie Basinger of Fortman Insurance called in to talk to Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Kim Nordhaus regarding the insurance eligibility for employees with reduced hours due to COVID-19. The Library employees are working from home when possible. The Insurance agents are not aware of the hours that are currently worked. The Commissioners do not control the Library payroll. The Commissioners have called all employees back to work on May 13 unless the employee has other underlying conditions. Adam asked about the County having the guidelines for all the County offices. Since the Library is under the County for insurance purposes they must be included under the same guidelines. The Library may not be operating under the same guidelines as the other County offices. CEBCO just needs a letter or document from the County stating how they are handling the limited work hours. Commissioners think there should be a set limit for the minimum hours. This is still an ever-changing situation. The Commissioners need to choose which option they would be following, of the options that were given by Adam. The options need to be kept generic to apply to all the departments across the board. The Commissioners should contact the Library also. There should be verbage included about employees being furloughed. Adam gave a scenario where an employer furloughed the employees but kept paying their insurance. Employees can be furloughed and the county can continue to pay their insurance. All employees must be treated the same.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers called Nancy Stauffer at the Library to discuss the insurance issues. Nancy said the hours of the staff are being cut most of the fulltime employees hours will be cut to less than 30 hours per week. The guidance given states that they must still maintain the retirement for the employees. A budget shortage of 25% is expected. The full-time employee hours were reduced in 2009 from 40 to 36. Sharework Ohio will cover 20% of the reduction in staff hours in unemployment. 12 employees would be furloughed or eliminated and losing those employees there would not be enough staff to open all the Library locations. They are hoping to open to curbside service next week. There are supervisors working limited hours currently. No one is getting furloughed at this time just reducing hours. The insurance continuation has not been discussed by the Library yet. They were hoping to keep everyone and hold their positions but they cannot continue to pay the insurance. Commissioner Lammers explained that the courthouse is going back to full staffing levels starting tomorrow but the administrative leave would continue until May 29 is medically necessary. The Commissioners have to decide what the limit will be on the hours worked to keep them on insurance. Will the Library open when the Stay at Home order is released? They will still have reduced hours and staffing.

Tim Schnipke stopped in again and said the courthouse project could be completed by Friday. A construction meeting will be set up with contractor and consultant.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers, Cindy Landwehr, Clerk.

The minutes from Thursday May 7, 2020 were reviewed and approved.
