Mr. Schroeder called the meeting to order with Mr. Schlumbohm and Mr. Lammers by reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Alaina Siefker discussed the possibilities of opening the recycling center on Saturdays.

Kim Redman met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to discuss employee compensation.

Mr. Lammers moved to go into executive session with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Kim Redman to discuss employee compensation for the Clerk of Courts department.

Mr. Schlumbohm seconded the motion.

The Commissioners went back on record at 9:35 a.m. No decisions were made.

The Commissioners discussed increasing the compensation line in the budget for Clerk of Courts and Title Dept with 50% of increase to be covered by Title surplus. The compensation for last half of year will be increased. The figures will have to be adjusted accordingly.

Tim Schnipke stopped in to inform the Commissioners of some damage at the Fairgrounds a hydrant was hit. And Glen Arnold drug the manure spreader through the paved parking lot with the knives down and cut into the pavement in multiple areas. The areas will need to be repaved to repair. The Commissioners will talk to Glen see if there is liability insurance that would cover the repairs.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Cindy Landwehr, Clerk.

The minutes from Thursday May 13, 2021 were reviewed and approved.

Ann Westrick called in to talk to Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers regarding community service projects for the juvenile probation clients. Ann proposed doing some work at the Fairgrounds and having the kids clean up trash and other odd jobs at the Fairgrounds. The Commissioner gave Ann contact info for Nathan Meyer to set up to get jobs done.

Kevin Niese and Gillian Stechschulte of Technicon Design Group met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to discuss the proposed county office building. Kevin has contacted all the offices within the upper floors of the courthouse and collected info for size and square footage needed. Kevin also collected the same info from the offices located within the Annex building. The Auditor, Treasurer and Recorder would stay together since they work hand in hand. Kevin suggested adding the DMV for office space if there is space available for them. Kevin presented plans to relocate the offices into the Courthouse and moving departments around. There are new building plans for the offices that are moving including a new Assembly Room/meeting room. The location of the new building was discussed with a few different location options within the vicinity to the courthouse. The new building is proposed as a two-story with a public area to approach each office. Rough schematic was presented to the Commissioners for review. The cost of the building was discussed, the current pricing is uncertain for fixing a final cost for the project. Commissioner Lammers asked about a smaller building just to rehome the offices from the Annex. Commissioner Schlumbohm stated no other building should be on the lot with the courthouse, since it is a historical building. If the building is connected to the courthouse, then the one security desk could be used as well as the handicap entrance. The Commissioners will review the plans that were presented, they will have to come to a decision one way or another. The cost of limestone for the facade would be double the price.

Kevin brought up the new building proposal for the Fairgrounds. He had a rough sketch for that building also. The grandstand was brought up. There are some concerns with the current grandstand but nothing alarming. The roof structure was in question. It was thought the roof was replaced when the press box was added. There are some areas in the roof that need repair. The Commissioners asked about replacing the grandstand and if plan could be drawn up. Kevin asked about a forensic engineer report on the grandstand. The Commissioners were uncertain about the engineer report, they want to know the cost for that service. The Commissioners will review the plans that were submitted and discuss at a future time.

Mr. Lammers moved to adjourn for lunch.

The Commissioners resumed session.

Mike Klear met with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers to discuss the 2021 & 2022 EMS/EMA budget. Mike had emailed on a few items on the American Rescue Act and was wondering if they heard anything on it. The commissioners said they haven't seen anything on it. Comm. Lammers said the money should be here toward the end of this month. One of the purchases with this was going to be the Tahoe for EMA for @ \$50,000 and about \$10,000 in equipment. They have heavy trailers they could move with it. The dealer that has the state bid contract is Ganley Chevrolet of Aurora but he does not have a vehicle right now. Mike Klear just asks them to remember that they didn't get much of the money from the Cares Act. All three commissioners are fine with him to go through with the process of getting the Tahoe. Schoolhouse at Emergency Operation Center in Klear's building needs technology upgraded. The quote is close to \$38,000. They said to have Joe Burkhart double check what upgrades needed but all three commissioners are fine with him to go through with that also. An item for budget on the EMA side- he gets a grant called EMPG from the State of Ohio right around \$33,000. It requires a 50% match reimbursement. Besides salaries and benefits through EMA it also pays some training, supplies, some of phones that EMS didn't cover, and HAZMAT supplies. This grant does not cover vehicles. The commissioners asked Mike Klear to check with the State if the grant could be used toward the technology upgrades. The commissioners said for 2022 he can count on a higher amount in the budget for EMA and they all three agreed to \$35,000 but to please make sure he checks on the grant and technology.

Lori Rayle stopped in to give an update on her process of hiring a new person. She is down to one prospect. She is disappointed that she did not have more applicants. She advertised with the Ohio Means Jobs and the Chamber of Commerce and still only got three applicants total. She is struggling to find someone before her part time help retires on June 4.

Steve Wilson of Army Corp, David Hayson and Nick Mueller of Stantec held a teleconference with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Greg Luersman to discuss the diversion channel floodplain change. The preliminary results for the change in the floodplain have been forwarded to the entities for review. The modeling from the old flood plain maps and converting to the new maps was explained. The project results were compared to the FEMA regulations. The benefits of the project were reviewed in table form. Figures were compared from prior to the project to after the project completion. There is a positive result for the project. The greatest impact area from the project is from the railroad bridge to Tawa Run along the

Blanchard. There will be a reduction of water elevation in the downtown area. Once all the projects in Findlay are complete how will it affect Ottawa. Steve thinks it will be a positive impact on Ottawa. The floodplain capacity will be increased in Findlay with Eagle Creek Storage Basin it will not increase the flow to Ottawa. The Conservancy District has received a grant to construct wetlands north of the diversion channel.

Mr. Lammers moved to adjourn for the day.
