Judge Borer stopped in to discuss a Probation employee and give updates on his grant funding. The use of video conferencing with his court was discussed. The Judge has a probation officer who handles community service. Community service is on hold right now. Probation officers will continue remote working. The probation secretary is not on current duty. She is not full time and is paid from a separate fund. The time frame is not known when the face to face sessions would be acceptable. The Commissioners are thinking that on May 29 everything will resume when the Stay Safe order is done, unless the employee is high risk. The Judge is willing to move money to pay her through unemployment if he is able. The Commissioners suggested he see what other counties are doing. The whole process will be looked at to change the procedures going forward to decrease contact due to the virus.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers, and Cindy Landwehr, Clerk.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers reviewed the recycling personnel staffing needs. Alaina Siefker shared that Joe and Adam will be accepting the positions and staying with the Recycling Program. The staffing needs of the program were discussed, the current sorters are adequate, although additional drivers would be needed. The current modified hours due to the COVID -19 are causing the employment issues. A driver position with about 20 hours per week would be needed. The possibility of additional weekend hours was asked. The staffing levels will be looked at if it would be feasible. Alaina will take care of talking to Joe about extending the hours.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers held discussions regarding the mowing needs at the landfill this year. The Commissioners would like to advertise for mowing at the

landfill. One time mowing mid-season would be needed for sure. Spraying would not be needed since the maintenance guys can do it.

Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers held discussion on the financing for the Sewer Dist #2 pump replacement project. The price of the project has gone down and the County may be in a position to advance the funds for the project with interest instead of borrowing the funds to cover the project.

The minutes from Thursday May 14, 2020 were reviewed and approved.
