Objections to the projects chosen for Program Year 2019: None

Comments or questions: Jeff Vance from Columbus Grove was under the impression that communities could only ask for a maximum of \$25,000. It was determined that this is not the case, but that when the CDBG Allocation Program was annual at \$75,000 with a max of three projects, it was difficult to fund more than \$25,000 per project. Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers had the pre-construction meeting to discuss the Courthouse renovations. Kevin Niese with Technicon Design Group, John & Craig from Schimmoeller Construction and Tim Schnipke from county maintenance also were in the meeting. Schimmoeller Construction brought samples of the tile. Kevin said the tile will have some variation in color. The commissioners said it is fine to have that variation in color because they aren't paying premium money to have the clay tile all look exactly the same. Tim said you will want to get a cost for the contractors wanting to run 2 additional downspouts. Kevin has the notice to proceed. Commr. Schlumbohm asked if the meetings for construction will be set up on a schedule or just as needed and who will attend them. Kevin and John Schimmoeller said they would both go. Schlumbohm said he would like to know when the meetings are so at least one of the commissioners can attend. Kevin said they will be working off of scaffolding. The tile is being made in Columbus and can have some to start in a week or so. John Schimmoeller said the roofer will go first, then Trisco will probably do their work and then Schimmoellers will finish up. Kevin said do you think we can break down the labor and material out for pay applications. Craig said he will have it broken out per trade. Payroll reports have to be done every week. Tim asked if there is any verbiage about ruining any concrete or grass areas and if whoever did it, will have it fixed. Craig said yes there is verbiage in the contract for that. Vince asked Ashley to come in to see if there is any information she will need from them. Craig said their

secretary has Ashley's contact info and this contact will be the same as when they worked on the Pandora project. Ashley reminded them that she will have to do wage interviews. Kevin said if sending a bill for any stored product off site to send a picture of it. John Schimmoeller asked about where to park equipment and vehicles. The commissioners said maybe Kevin could talk to the Village of Ottawa to see if they can have the street east of the building closed for that just during the week but open for the weekends. Schlumbohm asked Kevin to take out the poles and lines and he will look at photo shopping that out of the pictures for them. Craig and Kevin asked for a copy of the report from the asbestos testing. Kevin said he thinks the tile is put on by hand hammer and nail.

The minutes from Tuesday, May 21, 2019 were reviewed and approved. Auditor Bob Benroth and Kim Nordhaus came down to give the commissioners a quick update on sales tax figures in the county. John asked if the percentages are passed on population. Bob said he thinks at the time the percents were set like 60 some years ago and they set it on the need also. The budget commission is the one that approves the figures every year. John said he is going to take a copy of the report to the Mayor's Meeting tonight. The second handout for the sales tax was passed out. Our sales tax was very well. Motor vehicles was about 30%. Direct pay is like a construction company paying for goods or services without an actual customer walking in. John said like his flooring business, the carpet flooring has sales tax across the board. Hard surface flooring is not taxable if they buy it but we install it. Now if customer comes in and buys it to install it themselves then they get charged sales tax on it. Bob gave the minutes to Vince from the last BOR meeting. Bob gave the commissioners a sheet of the mapping of the solar proposed project in Miller City. Bob said he still has not received a bond for the Coroner yet. Commissioner Lammers said he will contact her again and ask her if she is getting that taken care of. Kim said the 1095s for taxes are filed by CEBCO at no cost with the IRS. The question Kim and Bob have, if you shop around and decide to leave CEBCO, will you be taking care of filing to the IRS. Kim said she just prints them herself to get them to the employees. She has to let them know by June 10th if we want them to take care of it. The commissioners said go ahead and have them do it. Bob said Ohio Checkbook is out there and the state auditors are
