Tim Schnipke stopped in to talk to the Commissioners regarding the maintenance projects. The price of concrete has gone up and he said to figure the total cost including labor to be three times the amount of the concrete. The prices and costs for everything is up. And concrete and stone costs will not go down. Tim said they have all the units in the courthouse working for a/c but they are not all replaced yet. The roof at the OSU Extension is prepped and ready to start. The sewer district projects were discussed.

Gary Lammers and Griffin Brinkman of the Prosecutor's office and Greg Bockrath and Seth Schroeder of Bockrath & Assoc. met with Commissioners to discuss the Sewer District #1 drainage project including the easements needed. Greg gave and update on the project. He said they are at a stalemate on the easements. Greg said the people who would have the easements have questions and are asking about compensation. They feel the property does have value. The Commissioners did talk about some amounts that could be offered. Commissioner Schlumbohm did state there would be some disruption to the appearance of the properties, and the settlement and reseeding of the yards was discussed. Total properties are

77 in the project with only a few needing easements and those few would have to deal with the restoring of their yards over the next few years. Would the other landowners be upset over the increase in the project cost to pay these easements? Greg said once all the plans are designed and approved the costs could be more defined. This project would cost these residents a couple hundred dollars with the grant without the grant it would cost them thousands of dollars. Gary reviewed the grant guidelines and asked again about the easements if it would be an allowable grant expense. Gary said he reviewed some other grant projects and found that the costs of the acquisitions could be covered by the grant rather than increasing the project cost. Greg said this is federal monies and it would take longer for approval of the expenses due to certifying appraisals then. Gary then referred to the ARP funds as a funding source to cover these expenses also. And the ARP guidelines have relaxed as the time has gone on. Gary says if the ARP funds are used for the easements, then it would save the project costs for all the residents. Greg said the easement acquisition was not included with the original grant application. This grant funding was a surprise and we should use what we have been given. Gary could call the proper authority for the grant funding and see if he could get an answer but in dealing with the federal government the timeframe of the answer is not known it could be a long wait. Once the easements are decided the project can move forward, pending the approval of the Village of Ottawa. Ottawa Township asked about repairing the roads after the project Greg said there is grant funding included to repair the roads after the project. The Commissioners and Gary agree that the project should not have any further delays. The certified appraisals would increase the time frame and the cost. So the project will move forward, a letter will go to the landowners to explain the project and the process. The Commissioners were questioning if the easement amount could be a set amount. Gary can prepare the easements for the projects, and have someone else prepare his own. Bockrath & Assoc is providing the legal descriptions. Greg said they need to get the easements drawn up to be delivered to the property owners to get things moving. If there is opposition to any of the easements they will go to another owner. Gary will start working on them as get them done as soon as he can. The estimated bid date is not set yet it depends on the easements getting done. At this point it will be a winter project.

Brenda Troyer stopped in to talk to Commissioners Schroeder and Lammers regarding the current audit. The audit concerning the Veteran Service Board is still ongoing also. The auditors will be meeting with the Commissioners in early July. The airport board was questioning why they have to have a separate audit and pay for it. If they get any large grant funding they would be having annual audits rather that the 2 year audit.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Cindy Landwehr, Clerk.

The minutes from Thursday May 26, 2022 were reviewed and approved.
