Tim Schnipke and Todd Worchuck met with Commissioners Schroeder and Schlumbohm to discuss the jail generator. Tim is collecting quotes for a new jail generator which is still a year out on installing. Quotes have been received on a Caterpillar and a Cummings he is still looking at one for a Kohler. The generator is checked every Tuesday. Could the old generator be transferred to the event center to provide for services if needed for an emergency? Yes, it could run that building. The generator does not full the full jail. Would it be worth it to install at event center if it is 25 years old. Are replacement parts still available? Motor parts are available but other parts are scarce. A new Caterpiller generator will be larger so the existing cement pad needs to be enlarged and the fence moved. The others are same size. There are new state regulations for fuel to follow for the new generator. Since it has been talked about to get a new generator the fuel tank has not been kept completely full. New generator will get a new tank. Tim does not think an electrical permit will be needed since they are replacing a generator with a generator. Bollards must be placed around the new tank. The fees for permits and updates were discussed if they would be needed. If permitted a set of ports would be installed to hook up another generator if the existing does not work which is additional cost also. A (UPS) Uninterrupted Power source does accommodate some of backups needed. Ther are sub-bases in the substation station near Silgan. Added secured fencing will be installed to keep the local critters (raccoon & opossum) out of the substation. Andy Schroeder of County Electric submitted a bill for installing a new generator. \$132,713 plus labor of \$73,680 tank testing \$9880. Totaling \$216,273.00 for installing the caterpillar generator. The Cummings is about \$2,000 cheaper. Servicing of the generator after installation was discussed. A final decision will be held until another quote is received from Kahle Electric also for the Kohler. E-911 budget will pay for the generator. The generator has been serviced for this year. Tim is recommending the Cummings from County Electric. County Electric currently performs the servicing. Todd will bring the final quotes to E-911 board for approval also. Updating the old generator to run the event center was discussed. The switch gears are in good condition. The expense for moving the generator to event center would start at \$50,000 to pour a new cement pad. The expense to upgrade the old generator will have to come from Caterpillar directly. It would be 50-60 weeks for delivery on a new generator.

The lettering for the Grandstand was presented from Buckeye Fabricating for \$8,200.00. Three ft green lettering for "Putnam County Fair" and two ft for "Established in 1855". The letters will be on rails and mounted on the building. The bolts needed and fastening the letters was discussed. Plans have been made for installing the letters. There is a lift available for the installation.

Tim informed the Commissioners about the gas line to the dog shelter. The request for the gas line to the dog shelter has been denied, even though it was approved in the spring. The expense to put in a gas line now would be in excess of \$100,000. Tim proposed running a 2" gas line from the Ag Complex. The gas company says a property line cannot be crossed. It was recommended to put in a propane tank for the dog shelter. The same was recommended for the maintenance building. The gas charges from the supplier, distributor and provider were discussed. Tim will contact Sarka Electric to see about converting the dog shelter equipment. Tim will contact Cherry's and Lakeside for propane services.

The business agenda was held with Commissioners Schroeder, Schlumbohm and Lammers and Cindy Landwehr, clerk.
