Commissioners Wehri, Schlumbohm and Brubaker attended a Teams meeting with Kevin Niese and Joe Ellerbrock of Technicon Design Group, Brian Hilvers and Kyle Hashbarger to discuss the generator for the EMS building addition. A question of the existing EMA and backup to the Sheriff's call center. The new facility would be an extension of the call center, so that changes the needs for a new generator. Is only one transfer switch needed or will two be needed to back-up the call center? There are batteries but they need to be replaced as they are at the end of life. A new UPS system is needed to back up the radio system. It was thought the new generator would be upgraded. it will be but the transfer switch was going to remain in service. A new transfer switch for the new building addition would be needed. For a cost savings the radios will remain where they are and Kyle will have to move to a different room. Rather than moving

all the wiring this would save money. If power would be lost there may be a chance that the whole building old and new may not both have power from the generator. Emergency equipment cannot be wired with optional equipment for the generator. Critical equipment may have to pull from the original generator. Is there critical equipment in the new section of the building? There will be certain outlets that are wired to the generator if power would go out. This is a back up call center so it would only be used if the Sheriff's office would lose power. There are only a couple areas in the new building addition that would need emergency power back-up. If the Emergency Operations Call center is open then a generator would be needed to keep it operational. Two transfer switches and one is optional than there would only be one manual switch. The emergency switch would be automatic. For new building it would be a normal transfer switch, there is nothing that will be critical where a power disruption would create an issue, no life support systems. A backup for county servers was discussed to be located at EMA, if it is located there the current system could handle it. These changes will be added to the drawings.
